CHAINS

Descend 700 ft. on S. slope.

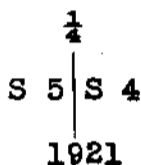
25.60 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course SE.; asc. 300 ft. on NE. slope.

35.35 Spur, slopes SE.

35.50 Blazed trail, bears NW. and SE.; desc. 90 ft. on S. slope.

38.70 Ravine, course SE.; asc. 20 ft. on NE. slope, to

40.10 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., with brass cap marked



from which,

A pine, 6 ins. diam., bears N.28\*E., 16 lks. dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 4 B T

A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S.3\*W., 44 lks. dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 5 B T

Thence over rolling E. slope.

55.25 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course E.; asc. 115 ft. on NE. slope.

60.25 Spur, slopes E.; desc. 250 ft. on SE. slope.

75.15 Ravine, course SE.; asc. 55 ft. on NE. slope, to

80.10 The cor. of secs. 4, 5, 8 and 9.

Land; mountainous.

Soil; clay loam, stony in places, 2nd and 3rd rate.

Timber; fir, hemlock, cedar, and pine.

Undergrowth; chinquapin, manzanita, fir, vine maple.

From the cor. of secs. 19 and 20, on N. bdy. of sec. 29, heretofore described.

N.0\*04'W., bet. secs. 19 and 20.

Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

Desc. 110 ft. on NW. slope.
