Land; mountainous.
Soil; stony clay loam, 2nd and 3rd rate.
Timber; fir, cedar, hemlock, and pine.
Undergrowth; chinquapin, hazel, fir.

S.89*50'E., on a random line, bet. secs. 17 and 20

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

80.24 Intersect N. and S. line, at cor. of secs. 16, 17, 20
and 21, heretofore described.

Thence

N.89*50'W., on a true line, bet. secs. 17 and 20.
Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense
undergrowth.

Desc. 15 ft. on slight NW. slope.

4.00 Draw, course N.; asc. 80 ft. on NE. slope.

13.20 Spur, slopes NE.; desc. 350 ft. on NW. slope.

28.90 Ravine, course NW.; asc. 25 ft. on NE. slope.

31.90 Small spur, slopes N.; descend 70 ft. on NW. slope.

40.12 In draw, course N.
Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in
the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked
