S.0\*20'W., on a true line, bet. secs. 5 and 6.  
Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

Asc. 60 ft. on N. slope.

2.20 Ridge, divide bet. Boulder and Rock Creeks, bears NE. and SW.; desc. 430 ft. on SE. slope.

10.90 Ravine, course E.; asc. 155 ft. on NE. slope.

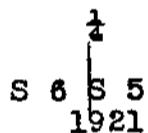
19.30 Spur, slopes NE.; desc. 10 ft. on SE. slope.

22.50 Draw, course E., asc. 105 ft. on NE. slope.

28.00 Ridge, bears NW. and SE.; desc. 470 ft. on S. slope.
