CHAINS

I commence at the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 1, on the E. Bdy. of the Tp., which is a basalt stone, 5x10x6 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. face, and witnessed as follows:

A fir, 7 ins. diam., bears S.71*W., 36 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 1 B T (Old B T.)

A pine, 24 ins. diam., bears N.42*W., 40 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 1 B T (Old B T.)

and run

North, retracing the E. bdy. of sec. 1.

Desc. NW. slope, 48 ft. through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

3.80 Top of spur, slopes NW., desc. NE. slope, 720 ft.

36.00 Foot of descent, enter creek bottom.

39.91 Intersect the cor. of Tps. 28 and 29 S., R. 1 W.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay loam, 4th rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock, pine, cedar, and chinquapin.

Undergrowth, salal, vinemaple, chinquapin, and rhododendron.
