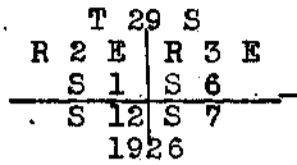


County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

from which

A cedar, 30 ins. dia., bears N. 59½\* E., 100 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 3 E S 6 BT.

A white fir, 12 ins. dia., bears S. 27\* E., 57 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 3 E S 7 BT.

A white pine, 16 ins. dia., bears S. 19\* W., 51 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 2 E S 12 BT.

A white Fir, 20 ins. dia., bears N. 72\* W., 37 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 2 E S 1 BT.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky, 3rd rate.

Timber, scattering, Douglas fir, white fir, cedar and pine.

Undergrowth, vine maple, rhododendron and chincapin.

North, bet. secs. 1 and 6.

Over mountainous land, through medium timber and dense undergrowth.

Ascend 110 ft. over SE. slope, to

10.00 Spur, slopes E. Descend 100 ft. over NE. slope

17.94 Fish Lake Trail, bears N. 60\* E., and S. 75\* W.

19.55 Dry ravine, course NE. Ascend 130 ft. over SE. slope.

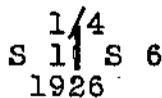
27.00 Spur, slopes NE. Descend 480 ft. over N. slope to

38.77 Dry ravine, course W. Leave Buckeye Burn, bears E. and W.

Ascend 50 ft. to

40.00 Spur, slopes W. Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in.

dia., 27 ins. in the ground, for ¼ sec. cor., with brass cap marked



from which

A Douglas fir, 14 ins. dia., bears N. 82 \* E., 35 lks. dist., marked ¼ S 6 BT.

A Douglas fir, 24 ins. dia., bears N. 37\* W., 30 lks. dist., marked ¼ S 1 BT.

Descend 500 ft. over broken N. slope.
