- 69.12 Spring branch, 2 lks. wide, course W.  
 74.00 Fish Lake Creek, 50 lks. wide, course S. 80 \* W. Cross a spur, 20 ft. high, sloping E., to  
 76.70 Fish Lake Creek, course S. 30\*E.  
 78.50 Same creek, course SW. Continue over low bottom land.  
 80.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. dia., 27 ins. in the ground for cor. of Tps. 28 and 29 S., Rs. 2 and 3 E., with brass cap marked

 A cedar, 10 ins. dia., bears S. 38 $\frac{1}{2}$ \* E., 116 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 3 E S 6 BT.  
 A white fir, 20 ins. dia., bears S. 10\* W., 12 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 2 E S 1 BT.  
 A maple, 15 ins. dia., bears N. 37\* W., 6 lks. dist., marked T 28 S R 2 E S 36 BT.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky with clay loam; 3rd rate.

Timber, Douglas fir, white fir, cedar and pine.

Undergrowth, chinquapin, vine maple, rhododendron and hazel.

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West, on a random line, along the N. Bdy. of Tp. 29 S., R 2 E., setting temp.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. and sec. cors. at intervals of 40.00 chs.; and at 476.00 chs. intersect the E. Bdy. of T. 29 S., R 1 E., 55 lks.
