An incense cedar, 36 ins. diam., bears S. 65*W., 18

lks. dist., mkd. T 29 S R 2 E S 4 B T

An incense cedar, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 23*W., 28

lks. dist., mkd. T 28 S R 2 E S 33 B T

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay loam; 2nd and 3rd rate.

Timber, Douglas fir, white fir, incense cedar, and sugar
pine.Undergrowth, rhododendron, buckbrush, chinquapin and
vinemaple.

S. 89*56'E., bet. secs. 3 and 34.

Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense
undergrowth.

Descend 420 ft. over broken NW. slope to Creek.

7.00 Dry gulch, 30 ft. deep, course N. 60*E.

14.75 Creek, 10 lks. wide, course N. 30*W. Ascend 75 ft. over
W. slope to

21.40 Low spur, slopes N. Descend 45 ft. to

23.25 Dry bed of stream, 20 lks. wide, (apparently abandoned)
