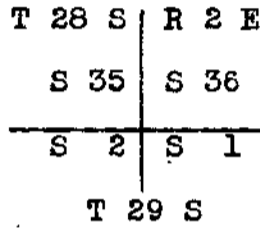

A Yellow Pine, 12 ins. diam., bears S.73½°W., 306 lks. dist., mkd. T 29 S R 2 E S 2 B T.

A Yellow Pine, 20 ins. diam., bears N.45°W., 81 lks. dist., mkd. T 28 S R 2 E S 35 B T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, clay loam and rocky, 2nd and 3rd rate.

Timber, Douglas Fir, White Fir, Cedar and Sugar Pine.

Undergrowth, Chinquapin, Madrona, Buckbrush and Vine-maple.

S.89°56'E., bet. Secs. 1 and 36.

Over mountainous land through dense undergrowth and scattering timber.
