CHAINS

Land, mountainous.

Soil, clay loam and rocky; 2nd and 3rd rate.

Timber, Douglas fir, white fir, incense cedar and sugar pine.

Undergrowth, rhododendron, vine maple and hazel.

From the cor. of secs. 3, 4, 33, and 34, on S. bdy. of Tp. hereinbefore described,

N. 0° 2' W., bet. secs. 33 and 34.

Over mountainous land, through heavy timber, and dense undergrowth.

Ascend 180 ft. over S. and SE. slope.

6.44 A trail, bears NE. and SW.

9.90 Top of ascent, slopes SE. Descend 25 ft. over NE. slope.

14.17 Brook, 1 link wide, course SE. Ascend 750 ft. over SE. slope to
