A Douglas fir, 20 ins. dia., bears S. 28°E., 19 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 20 BT.

Ascend 110 ft., over NE. slope to

45.60 Spur, slopes N. Descend 250 ft., over W. slope.

62.80 Brook, 1 link wide, course N. Ascend 230 ft., over NE. slope.

78.50 Spur, slopes N. Descend gradually to

79.52 The cor. of secs. 17, 18, 19 and 20.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay loam; 3rd and 2nd rate, and 4th rate.

Timber, fir, pine and cedar.

Undergrowth, rhododendron, chinquapin, vine maple and fir.

N. 89° 43' W., on a random line, bet. secs. 18 and 19.

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

76.40 Intersect W. bdy. of Tp., 7 lks. N. of the cor. of secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24, which is an iron post, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described in notes of E. Bdy. of T. 29 S., R. 2 E.

Thence;

S. 89° 46' E., on a true line, bet. secs. 18 and 19.

Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

Along steep, broken N. slope.

2.75 Draw, opens N. Ascend 125 ft., over W. slope.

7.30 Spur, slopes N. Descend 250 ft., over NE. slope to brook.

7.90 Descend bluff 25 ft. high, bearing NW. and SE.

13.45 Brook, 1 link wide, course N. Ascend 375 ft.

24.70 Spur, slopes N. Descend 260 ft., over broken NE. slope.

33.79 Creek, 10 lks. wide, course N. 30° W. Ascend 150 ft., over W. slope to

36.40 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. dia., 27 ins. in the
