CHAINS

- 40.10 Spur, slopes NW. Descend 50 ft., over NE. slope.
- 44.00 Draw, opens N. Ascend 400 ft., over SW. slope.
- 57.70 Spur, slopes N.30*W. Descend 150 ft., over NE. slope to
- 72.00 Draw, opens N. Ascend 100 ft., over NW. slope to
- 76.28 The cor. of secs. 7, 8, 17 and 18.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, clay loam and rocky; 2nd and 3rd rate.

Timber, fir, pine and cedar.

Undergrowth, rhododendron, chinquapin and vine maple.

N.0* 4' W., bet. secs. 7 and 8.

Over mountainous land, through heavy timber, and dense undergrowth.

Descend 420 ft., over NW. slope to $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
