CHAINS

No evidences of minerals are noted.

Water, sufficient for all present, or probable future needs, is afforded by springs and brooks.

There is one Forest Homestead lying wholly in section 7; (Homestead Entry Survey number 192) on which considerable improvements have been made, but is not now occupied, and the improvements are deteriorating.

The U.S. Forest Service maintains trails, mainly following the two principal ridges which extend E. and W. through the township. The most used trails follows the South Umpqua and Fish Lake Creek, after leaving the latter, enters the township on north boundary of sec. 2, thence through sections 2, 1, 12 and 13, the principal objectives being the cattle range which lies principally in sections 11, 12, 13 and 14, and the Grasshopper Lookout Station on Grasshopper Mountain, which lies just east of section 13.

Declination of the magnetic needle ranges from 19*45' to 22* 15', the average being 20*45'E. of N.
