0.90	Spring branch, 2 lks. wide, course SW., thence over cliffs, bearing NE. and nearly S., impassable on line.
30.55	Leave cliffs, bearing SE., and nearly N. at a point 15 ft. higher than the cor. of secs. 2,3,34 and 35; desc. 60 ft. over SW. slope.
34.75	Foot of desc. on W. slope, thence over W. slope to
39.58	Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 30 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. with brass cap marked $S \frac{3}{4} S 2$ 1927
	from which A Fir, 20 ins. in diam., bears N.62 $\frac{1}{2}$ *E., 45 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 2 B T. A Fir, 36 ins. in diam., bears S.78 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W., 25 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 3 B T.
	Desc. 20 ft. over SW. slope.
40.15	Draw, drains NW., asc. 400 ft. over N. and NW. slopes.
72.00	Spur, slopes W., desc. 25 ft. over SW. slope.
74.00	Leave timber and undergrowth, bears E. and W., enter grassy opening.
76.00	Foot of desc. on NW.slope, asc. 35 ft. over NW. slope to sec. cor.
79.00	Enter medium timber and light undergrowth, bears NE. and NW.
79.58	The cor. of secs.2,3,10 and 11. Land, mountainous. Soil, gravelly and rocky, 2nd and 4th rate. Timber, fir, pine and hemlock. Undergrowth, huckleberry, vine maple, small fir, pine and yew.
