CHAINS

east of the SW. corner.

The soil is sandy and gravelly, varying from a few inches to several feet in depth on rock subsoil, which outcrops in many places.

The lower and sheltered portions have a fair stand of timber, except where it has been destroyed by fire.

On the higher and exposed parts the timber is scrubby.

Douglas fir is the principal timber.

There is considerable open grassy land, used for grazing.

The only known mineral is some sulphur in section 3.

The Township is well watered.

The trails, telephone lines of the Forest Service and their lookout in section 22, are the only improvements.

The average magnetic declination is 20*East, with about 3*. variation each side of the mean.
