East Boundary.

CHAINS

Land, mountainous,
Soil, sandy loam and rocky. 2nd to 4th rate.
Timber, fir, hemlock, pine, larch, and cedar.
Undergrowth, mountain laurel, chinquapin, small fir,
hemlock, and cedar.

North Boundary.

From the cor. to Ts. 28 and 29 S., Rs. 4 and 5 E.
West, on a random line, setting temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cors. and
sec. cors. alternately at intervals of 40.00 chs.

479.06 Intersect E. bdy. of T. 28 S., R. 3 E., 8 lks. N. of
the cor. of Ts. 28 and 29 S., Rs. 3 and 4 E.

The bearing and length of this line is N. 89°59' E.,
479.06 chs.

From the cor. of Ts. 28 and 29 S., Rs. 3 and 4 E., which
is an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set in a mound of
stone, with brass cap mkd. and witnessed as described
in the field notes of T. 29 S., R. 3 E.

N. 89°59' E., on a true line bet. secs. 6 and 31.

Desc. 105 ft. over NE. slope, through heavy timber and
light undergrowth.

6.25 Creek, 6 lks. wide, course NE.

14.00 Foot of desc. on N. slope; asc. 60 ft. over NW. slope.

21.00 Spur, bears N.; desc. 75 ft. over NE. slope.

25.90 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course N.; thence over N. slope to
 $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

37.80 Trail, bears NW. and SE.

39.06 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 12 ins. in
the ground, to rock, and build a mound of stone, 3 ft.
