Land; mountainous and rolling.

Soil; sandy, gravelly, and rocky, 2nd to 4th rate.

Timber; fir, pine, and hemlock.

Undergrowth; mountain laurel, huckleberry, small fir,
pine, and hemlock.

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General Description.

This township contains all varieties of land from level
bottom and bench land to cliffs and rugged mountains.

The elevation varies from 3600 ft. above sea level,
on the Rogue River on the south boundary of section
32, to 5900 ft. on the west boundary of section 7.

There are also several places on the east boundary
of the township that have an elevation of over 5000
ft.

The predominating sandy soil is mostly disintegrated
pumice stone and not holding moisture well it is
classed as second rate.

The drainage is into the Rogue River which enters the
township on the north boundary of section 2 and
leaves on the south boundary of section 32.

There is considerable good pasture land, along the
Rogue River, and along Foster and Sherwood Creeks.

The other large stream, National Creek, flows in a
sharp canyon and has no bottom land along it.

About half of the township is covered with a good stand
of fair timber, there is much second growth timber
and dense undergrowth in the other parts of the
surface.
