80.40 Intersect N. and S. line, 4 lks. S. of the cor. of secs. 4, 5, 8, and 9.

Thence

S.89°58'W., on a true line bet. secs. 5 and 8.

Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

Descend 300 ft. over W. slope.

8.92 Top of bluff, 50 ft. high, bears NW. and SE.

9.93 Foot of same, continue to descend.

15.00 Creek, 8 lks. wide, course S. Ascend 250 ft. to $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

25.15 Brook, 3 lks. wide, course SE.

38.65 Ascend bluff, 30 ft. high, bears NW. and SE.

40.20 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked

Land, mountainous.

Soil, clay loam, stony in places, 2nd. and 3rd. rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock, pine, and cedar.

Undergrowth, laurel, manzanita, chinquapin, hazel, and vine maple.
