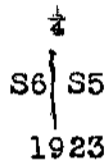
CHAINS

Ascend 360 ft. over SW. slope to

21.10 Spur, slopes SE., continue along E. slope to

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., with brass cap marked

A Fir, 54 ins. diam., bears N.35\*E., 5 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 5 B T.

A Fir, 28 ins. diam., bears S.5\*W., 28 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 6 B T.

Descend 220 ft. over gradual NE. slope.

71.22 Brook, 2 lks. wide, course NE., ascend 130 ft. over SE. slope to

80.65 Intersect S. bdy. of T. 29 S., R. 1 E., 98 lks. E. of the old cor. of Secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, changed to refer to Secs. 31 and 32 only, hereinbefore described.

At the point of intersection set closing cor. of Secs. 5 and 6, hereinbefore described.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, clay loam, second and third rate.

Timber, Fir, Hemlock, Pine and Cedar.

Undergrowth, rhododendron, chinquapin, vine-maple and hazel, hemlock and fir.
