vation is from about 2000 feet at the river on the West boundary to nearly 5000 feet at the highest points on the South boundary. Above the river canyon on both sides are many benches and gentle slopes. The portion South of the river is generally heavily timbered, mainly with Fir, interspersed with Hemlock, Cedar and Pine. North of the river, the timber is more scattering, though small bodies of dense timber are found in nearly every portion, and this area contains numerous glades and openings and is very fair grazing land. Portions also are suitable for agriculture. No evidence of mineral was found. The normal magnetic declination is about 21*E., and there is considerable local irregularity. The nearest supply point is Tiller, 20 to 25 miles distant by trail from the Western boundary.
