27.50	Leave bench, descend gently.
40.00	Set a stone 14x14x3 ins., 10 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ S cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. side. from which, A white fir, 40 ins. in dia., bears S.11°W., 12 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T A white fir, 10 ins. in dia., bears N.39°E., 28 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T
48.50	A branch, 3 lks. wide course SE. Ascend.
54.00	Top of a ridge. Descend.
80.00	A point about 140 ft. below last sect. cor. set a basalt stone 14x10x5 ins., 9 ins. in the ground for cor. to secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35 marked with 2 notches on E. and 4 notches on W. edges, from which, A white fir, 24 ins. in dia., bears S.51°W., 25 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 2 E S 3 B T A white fir, 16 ins. in dia., bears N.24°W., 51 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 2 E S 34 B T A white fir, 10 ins. in dia., bears S.66°E., 35 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 2 E S 2 B T A white fir, 24 ins. in dia., bears N.36°E., 50 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 2 E S 35 B T Land, gently rolling. Descending toward the East. Soil, 1st rate. Timber, fir, larch and cedar. Undergrowth, summac, hazel and huckleberry. Heavily timbered and mountainous. 80 chs. August 3, 1891.
