A matheron, 7 ins. diam., bears S.22*W., 40 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

68.75 Creek, 15 lks. wide, runs S.30*E. at a point about 400 ft. below $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

Ascend 150 ft. to,

80.00 Set a fir post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for cor. to secs. 3, 4, 33, and 34, marked T 31 S S 34 on NE., R 1 E S 3 on SE., T 32 S S 4 on SW., and S 33 on NW., faces, with 3 notches on E. and W. edges, from which,

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.25*E., 50 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 1 E S 34 B T.

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S.58*E., 9 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 1 E S 3 B T.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.33*W., 23 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 1 E S 4 B T.

A sugar pine, 12 ins. diam., bears N.10*W., 85 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 1 E S 33 B T.

Land, high and mountainous.

Soil, 3rd rate.

Covered with dense forests of fir, sugar pine, and matheron, and some live oak. 80 chs.

Thick undergrowth of fir, matheron and buckbrush.
