## General Description.

The land in this township is mountainous and generally broken.

The soil is of 2nd and 3rd rate quality.

This township is generally covered with dense forests of fir, cedar, pine, oak, and matheron timber and thick undergrowth of fir, matheron, dogwood, maple, and arrowwood.

There is one settler in the Southwestern portion of the township.

Ascending through heavy timber.

14.00 A spring, course SW.

40.00 Set  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. about 100 ft. above Tp. cor. a basalt stone, 14x12x8, 9 ins. in ground, marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  on W. face, from which,

A cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears S.85 $\frac{1}{2}$ \*W., 36 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.

A white fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.40\*E., 41 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.

60.00 Top of a ridge, E. and W. Descend.

64.00 Bottom of a hollow.

66.50 Top of a ridge.

72.00 Enter vine maple thicket.

76.00 A branch, 2 lks. wide, course W.

80.00 Set a stone, 12x6x6, 8 ins. in the ground, for cor. secs. 25, 30, 31, and 36, marked with 1 notch on the S. and 5 notches on the N. edges, from which,

A matheron, 5 ins. diam., bears N.47\*W., 52 lks.
