Land, broken and mountainous.

Soil, 2nd rate.

Timber, pine and fir.

Undergrowth, vine maple and lilac.

Mountainous and heavily timbered. 43.00 chs.

Dense undergrowth and mountainous 37.00 chs.

Through dense lilac brush, descending.

38.00 A creek, 10 lks. wide, course SE. Enter a burn.

40.00 Set a stone for ¼ sec. cor., 16x14x4, 12 ins. in ground, marked ¼ on W. face. Erected a mound of stone, 1½ ft. high and 2 ft. base, alongside. Pits impracticable.

67.50 A creek, 10 lks. wide, course SW. Leave burn, ascend, enter fir timber.

80.00 Set a stone for cor. to secs. 12, 13, 7 and 18, 16x12x12, 12 ins. in the ground, marked with 2 notches on N. and 4 notches on S. edge, from which

dist., marked T 31 S R 2 E S 7 B T.

A red fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.66\*W., 77 lks.  
dist., marked T 31 S R 1 E S 12 B T.

A chinquapin, 10 ins. diam., bears S.72\*E., 46 lks.  
dist., marked T 31 S R 2 E S 18 B T.

A red fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.49\*W., 120 lks.  
dist., marked T 31 S R 1 E S 13 B T.
