marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.

75.75 Umpqua Trail, course E. and W. Summit of Umpqua Divide.

80.00 Set a stone, 14x10x8, 9 ins. in the ground, for cor. to  
secs. 1, 12, 6 and 7, with 1 notch on N. and 5 notches  
on S. edges, from which,

A white fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S.59°E., 49 lks.  
dist., marked T 31 S R 2 E S 7 B T.

A white fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.23°W., 41 lks.  
dist., marked T 31 S R 1 E S 12 B T.

A white fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.46°E., 190 lks.  
dist., marked T 31 S R 2 E S 6

A white fir, 40 ins. diam., bears N.75°W., 138 lks.  
dist., marked T 31 S R 1 E S 1 B T.
