Land, mountainous.
Soil, rocky, 4th rate.
Timber, fir and cedar.
Undergrowth, vine maple.

North, on E. bdy. of sec. 1.

Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

6.00 Desc. 25 ft. to

9.62 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 6 only, with brass cap marked

A cedar, 12 ins. diam., bears N.36*E., 31 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 6 B T.

A cedar, 20 ins. diam., bears S.55*W., 46 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 6 B T.

9.94 Spring branch, 3 lks. wide, course SW.; asc. 533 ft. over S. slope.

14.36 Trail, from Whiskey Camp to Beaver Lake, bears E. and W.

38.20 Top of ridge, bears E. and W.; desc. 27 ft. over NW. slope.

40.00 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. established for secs. 1 and 6, which is a basalt stone, firmly set, 5x12x6 ins. above ground, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. face; from which

A fir, 50 ins. diam., bears N.70*E., 22 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 6 B T (Old BT.)

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.30*W., 79 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 1 B T (Old BT.)

I now change this cor. to refer to sec. 1 only, and obliterate the marks on the bearing tree referring to sec. 6.
