

Subdivisions of T. 31 S., R. 1 E.

CHAINS

¼ sec. cor. is in swampy draw, opening NW.

Enter heavy timber, bears E. and W.

Descend gradually.

45.57 Trail, bears E. and W.

47.74 Brook, 3 lks. wide, course SW.; ascend 150 ft. over SW. slope.

53.68 Brook, 1 lk. wide, course SW.

58.22 Sugar Pine - Beaver Lake trail, bears E. and W.

61.80 Ridge, divide bet. Beaver Creek and South Fork of South Umpqua River, bears E. and W.; descend gradually on NW. slope.

63.29 Trail, bears E. and W.

80.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9, and 10, with brass cap marked

A fir, 60 ins. diam., bears N.41*E., 72 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 1 E S 3 B T.

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S.49*E., 83 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 1 E S 10 B T.

A fir, 32 ins. diam., bears S.69*W., 37 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 1 E S 9 B T.

A cedar, 28 ins. diam., bears N.40*W., 28 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 1 E S 4 B T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, clay loam and rocky, 2nd and 3rd rate.

Timber, fir, cedar, and pine.

Undergrowth, willow, wild cherry, snowbrush, chinquapin, rhododendron, and vine maple.
