

Subdivisions of T. 31 S., R. 1 E.

CHAINS

A live oak, 8 ins. diam., bears N.44*W., 27 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 32 B T.

Ascend 200 ft. on NE. slope.

44.80 Ridge, divide bet. Pelt and Hawk Creeks, bears NE. and SW.; descend 620 ft. on general S. slope to sec. cor.

55.75 Small spur, slopes SW.

62.50 Point of rocky spur, slopes SE.

66.75 Rocky draw, opens SW.

77.53 The cor. of secs. 32 and 33.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, stony, 3rd and 4th rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock, and pine.

Undergrowth, live oak, chinquapin, laurel, hazel, and vine maple.

From the cor. of secs. 27, 28, 33, and 34, West, on a sectional correction line, bet. secs. 28 and 33.

Over mountainous land, through heavy timber in clumps, and dense undergrowth.

Descend 375 ft. over SW. slope.

10.90 Dry ravine, course SE.; ascend 200 ft. over SE. slope.

18.00 Spur, slopes S.; descend 500 ft. over SW. slope.

34.96 Dry ravine, course S.; ascend 200 ft. to

39.94 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked
