40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.79.70 Intersect N. and S. line, 21 lks. N. of the cor. of secs.
9, 10, 15, and 16.

Thence

West, on a true line, bet. secs. 9 and 16.

Over rolling land, through old burn and medium dense
undergrowth.3.77 Sugar Pine Ranger Station fence, bears NE. and SW.;
ascend 70 ft. over E. slope, to8.50 Spur, slope S.; descend 375 ft. to $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

19.00 Enter green timber, bears N. and S.

23.15 Brook, 2 lks. wide, course SW.

24.25 Trail, at forks, bears N. to Serviceberry, SE. to Sugar
Pine Ranger Station, and SW. to Devil's Knob.
