Ascend 50 ft. to

45.00 Summit of Elkhorn Mt., at saddle bet. the two peaks, bears E. and W.; descend gradually to

69.00 Descend 250 ft. over NW. slope to sec. cor.

79.03 Trail, bears NE. and SW.

80.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 19, 20, 29, and 30, with brass cap marked

A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears N.65*E., 26 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 1 E S 20 B T.

A fir, 52 ins. diam., bears S.20*E., 82 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 1 E S 29 B T.

A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S.23*W., 56 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 1 E S 30 B T.

A fir, 42 ins. diam., bears N.30*W., 45 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 1 E S 19 B T.

Elkhorn spring bears S.66*W., 6.80 chs. dist.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, clay loam and rocky, 2nd, 3rd and 4th rate.

Timber, fir, pine, cedar, and hemlock.

Undergrowth, rhododendron, and vine maple, scattering on S. slopes, dense on N. slopes.

East, on a random line, bet. secs. 20 and 29.

40.00 Set temp. 1/4 sec. cor.

79.70 Intersect N. and S. line, 7 lks. N. of cor. of secs. 20, 21, 28, and 29.

Thence

N.89*57'W., on a true line, bet. secs. 20 and 29.

Over mountainous land, through old burn and dense undergrowth.
