- 40.00 Set temp.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.
- 79.50 Intersect N. bdy. of the Tp., 12 lks. E. of the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31, and 32, heretofore described.
- Thence
- S.0\*09'E., on a true line, bet. secs. 5 and 6.
- Over mountainous land, through old burn and dense undergrowth.
- Descend 550 ft. over SE. slope.
- 39.50 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., with brass cap marked
