I then began at the corner to Township 31 and 32 S., Ranges 2 and 3 East which is a fir stake, 5 inches sq., marked

T 31 S S 31 on NE.

R 3 E S 6 on SE.

T 32 S S 1 on SW.

R 2 E S 36 on NW.

from which

A Fir, 4 ins, diam., bears N.41*E., 8 lks.

dist. marked T 31 S R 3 E S 31 B T.

A Laurel, 8 ins. diam., bears S.9*E., 8 lks.

dist. marked T 32 S R 3 E S 6 B T.

A Fir, 4 ins. diam., bears N.9*W., 35 lks.

dist. marked T 31 S R 2 E S 36 B T.

A Willow, 6 ins. diam., bears S.75*W., 19 lks.

dist. marked T 32 S R 2 E S 1 B T.

Thence I run

N.89*36'W. bet. secs. 1 and 36.

Var.19*30'E.

Ascending along timbered ridge.

40.00 Found old $\frac{1}{4}$ S cor. which is a stake, from which

A Laurel, 6 ins. diam., bears S.8*E., 8 lks.

marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

A Chinquapin, 8 ins. diam., bears N.40*E., 14 lks.

marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. stake being almost entirely decayed.

Set a stone, 12x8x8 ins. 8 ins. in the ground, marked

$\frac{1}{4}$ on N face, in the place of the stake for $\frac{1}{4}$ S cor.

49.00 Descend into canyon.

67.25 A branch, 2 lks. wide, course South. Ascend.

78.90 The old cor. to secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36 bears South 02 lks. which is a stake, 4 ins. sq., 2 ft. high, almost
