10.00	A branch, 5 lks. wide, course South.	
13.00	Top of a ridge, N and S.	
14.00	Branch 1 lk. wide, South.	
30.00	Top of rocky peak, enter old burn (Lilac brush)	+ 400
38.20	The old $\frac{1}{4}$ S cor. bears South 24 lks. the original witness trees being almost totally destroyed and no trees available.	
	Set a stone, 10x10x10 7 ins. in the ground, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N face, for $\frac{1}{4}$ S. cor. in mound of stone and raised mound of stone, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high 2 ft. base alongside pits impracticable, at a point 180 lks. West of old $\frac{1}{4}$ S. Cor.	
40.00	Set a stone, 24x14x4 ins. 8 ins. in the ground on bedrock, in mound of stone, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N face, for $\frac{1}{4}$ S on S bdy. sec. 34 and there being no Witness Trees available raised mound of stone 2 ft. base 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high alongside pits impracticable.

65.50	A branch, 5 lks. wide, course South.	
67.00	A branch, 4 lks. wide, course South.	
77.44	Old cor. to secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34 bears S.52 lks. which is a stake, 2 ft. high, marks not legible, renewed with a stone 12x8x8 ins. 8 ins. in the ground, marked North 3 notches on E and 3 notches on W edges, from which the original bearing Trees, bear as follows;
