N.0°04'W., on true line bet. secs. 29 and 30.

Descend gently in heavy timber.

11.75 A branch, 4 lks. wide, course SW. about 50 ft. below cor.

21.75 A branch, 2 lks. wide, course SE. about 25 ft. below cor. Ascend.

40.00 A point, about 100 ft. above cor, set a stone, 12x10x8 ins. 8 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{2}$  sec. cor. marked  $\frac{1}{2}$  on W. face, from which

A Red Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.82°E., 48 lks. marked  $\frac{1}{2}$  S B T.

A Cedar, 16 ins. diam., bears N.20°W., 35 lks. marked  $\frac{1}{2}$  S B T.

45.00 Enter dense Balm thicket E. and W.

80.00 A point, about 300 ft. above Sec. Cor.

Set a stone, 12x8x8 ins. 8 ins. in the ground, for cor. to secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30 marked 2 notches on S. and 5 notches on E. edge, from which

A Sugar Pine, 9 ins. diam., bears N.9°E., 54 lks. marked T 31 S R 2 E S 20 B T.

A Cedar, 6 ins. diam., bears N.79°W., 31 lks. marked T 31 S R 2 E S 19 B T.
