CHAINS

59 miles 64 chains 94 lks. of the subdivision lines of this Tp. are over land heavily timbered mountainous or covered with dense undergrowth.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This Township is all mountainous and is heavily timbered in its entirety, the Southern, Central and Eastern portions being covered with Fir, Pine, Cedar and Hemlock. Fir, being the principal timber. There is some White Pine in the eastern part; some Sugar Pine on the ridges and higher portions of the Southern and Eastern part; and a small area of Larch or Noble Fir, in the Northwestern part. Wherever the land is not too steep the soil appears to be good and would be susceptible of profitable cultivation if the timber and brush were removed. There is one settler in sec. 36 and two in sec. 13 of this Tp.

The mean variation of the needle is about 19°30'E.
