	<p>A hemlock, 10 ins. diam., bears N.30°E., 39 lks. dist., marked T20S R8W S35BT.</p> <p>A fir, 50 ins. diam., bears S.59$\frac{1}{4}$° W., 59 lks. dist., marked T21S R8W S3 BT.</p> <p>Land mountainous. Soil, sandy clay loam and rocky clay. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, chinquapin, madrona, and dogwood. Undergrowth, vine maple, salmonberry, thimbleberry, slickleaf, hazel, evergreen huckleberry, red huckleberry, devil's club, salal, Oregon grape, and bracken.</p> <hr/> <p>N. 87° 55' W., bet. secs. 3 and 34.</p> <p>Ascend 5 ft. along N. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.</p>
1.00	A spur ridge, bears NW. and S.80°E.; desc. 310 ft. over SW. slope.
27.30	A branch, 2 lks. wide, course S. 15°W.; asc. 15 ft. over SE. slope.
28.50	Top of ascent on S. slope; desc. 31 ft. over broken SW. slope.
34.50	A branch, 2 lks. wide, course S.15 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W.; asc. 91 ft. over SE. slope.
38.60	Top of ascent on S. slope; desc. 22 ft. over SW. slope.

Soil, sandy clay loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, chinquapin, madrona, and dogwood.</p>
