

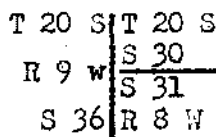
Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the East Boundary  
of T. 20 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

- 3.85 A ridge; the divide bet. Big Creek and Scare Creek, bears S.43°W. and North; a spur, slopes SE.; desc. 37 ft. along back of ridge.
- 7.00 A dirt fire road, bears N.5°E. and SW.; thence along road, in saddle of ridge.
- 9.80 Leave road, bears S.5°W. and NE.; asc. 70 ft. along ridge.
- 18.00 Top of ascent; the divide bet. Big Creek and Scare Creek, bears South; the divide bet. Big Creek and Beaver Creek, bears East; the divide bet. Scare Creek and Beaver Creek, bears N. 50°W.; a spur ridge, bears N.20°E.; desc. 690 ft. over precipitous NW slope.
- 39.22 Point for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 31, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.  
  
Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

 A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears N.57°E., 108 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S31 BT.  
  
 A hemlock, 24 ins. diam., bears S.24°E., 59 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S31 BT.  
  
 Descend 30 ft. over NW. slope.
- 40.50 The dry bed of a stream, 5 lks. wide, course N.30°E.; asc. 165 ft. over SE. slope.
- 52.00 A spur, slopes N.30°E.; desc. 295 ft. over N. slope.
- 56.30 The dry bed of a stream, 4 lks wide, course N. 60°E.; asc. 310 ft. over SE. slope.
- 62.80 A spur, slopes NE.; desc. 495 ft. over broken NW. slope.
- 76.10 The dry bed of a stream. 4 lks. wide, course N.65°E.; asc. 85 ft. over SE. slope.
- 78.44 Point for the cor. of secs. 30 and 31, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.  
  
Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 33 lks. dist., marked T20S R8W S30 B.T.

A fir 20 ins. diam., bears S.34 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 34lks. dist., marked T20S R8W S31 BT.

Land mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay and sandy clay loam.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, dogwood, and wild cherry.
