| 18.30 | A ravine, course N.80°E., at forks from S.60°W. and N.80°W.; asc. 350 ft. over S. slope. |
| 28.65 | A spur, slopes E.; desc. 130 ft. over N. slope. |
| 31.20 | A ravine, course N.60°E., asc. 130 ft. over SE. slope. |
| 35.30 | A spur, slopes N.80°E., desc. 250 ft. over N. slope, changing to NW. slope. |
| 39.11 | Point for witness to the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 30. Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked <div style="text-align: center;"> W C $\frac{1}{4}$ S 30 1950 </div> |
| 39.22 | The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 30, monumented with a fir stub, 14 ins. diam., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on E. and W. faces; from which A fir stub, 6 ins. diam., bears S. 65° W., 7 lks. dist., with partial scribe marks uncovered. (Record, 6 lks. dist.) A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.85 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 22 lks. dist., with old blaze healed. (Record, S.85°E., 21 lks. dist.) A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N.33° E., 39 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 30 BT. (New B.T.) The point for cor. is occupied by a fir stub, 14 ins. diam., where it is impracticable to establish a permanent monument. <hr style="width: 20%; margin: auto;"/> N. 0° 44' E., beginning new measurement. Descend 290 ft. over NW. slope. |
| 6.50 | Beaver Creek, at mouth of raving from S. 10°W., 6 lks. wide, course N.80°W.; asc. 350 ft. over general S. slope. |
| 18.00 | A spur, slopes N.60°W.; desc. 130 ft. over NW. slope. |
| 22.00 | A ravine, course W.; thence along broken W. slope. |
| 26.50 | A branch, 1 lk. wide, course W.; asc. 40 ft. over SW. slope, changing to broken W. slope. |
| 32.00 | A branch, 1 lk. wide, course W.; asc. 70 ft. over SW. slope. |
| 39.68 | The cor. of secs. 19 and 30, determined at the record bearing and distance from the original SW. bearing tree as follows: A fir, 32 ins. diam., bears S. 21°W., 71 lks. dist., plainly blazed and healed. The three cedar bearing trees, which were evidently dead when marked, have been uprooted; these trees occupy the approximate |
