

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the West Boundary  
of T. 20 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground with brass cap marked

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 58° E., 25 lks. dist., marked T20S R8W S30 BT.

Land mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay and sandy clay loam.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder chinquapin, madrona, yew, dogwood, and cascara.

Undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, evergreen, huckleberry, salmon-berry, devil's-club, slickleaf, thimbleberry, red huckleberry, poison oak and salal.

Lines of T. 20 S., R 8 W.  
(Restoring the 1884 survey of William Wright)

From the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35, and 36, on the S. bdy. of the Tp. N. 2° 23' E., bet. secs. 35 and 36, marking and blazing the true line.

Ascend 50 ft. over SE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

4.00 A spur ridge, bears N.20°E., and S.10°W.; asc. 250 ft. over broken SW. slope.

22.00 Recross spur ridge; bears N.10°W. and S.10°E.; asc. 25 ft. along E. slope.

29.00 A spur, slopes E.; desc. 220 ft. over broken NE. slope.

35.00 A ravine, course S.85°E.; asc. 140 ft. over broken SE. slope.

41.30 A spur, slopes N.80°E.; desc. 80 ft. over N. slope.

41.995 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 35 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
