

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Subdivisional
Lines of T. 20 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS	
6.90	A spur, slopes N.30°E.; desc. 85 ft. along steep N slope.
12.40	A ravine, course NE.; asc. 520 ft. over SE. slope, changing to E. slope.
27.10	A ridge, bears N.20°W. and S.20°E.; desc. 115 ft. over gentle W. slope.
38.40	A blazed trail, bears N.20°W. and SE.
39.01	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 24 and 25, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
	Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked $\frac{1}{4} \frac{S 24}{S 25}$ 1950
	from which A hemlock, 40 ins. diam., bears N.36°W., 60 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S24 BT. A hemlock, 26 ins. diam., bears S.9°W., 26 lks dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S25 BT.
	Descend 90 ft. over gentle W. slope.
47.50	A branch, 1 lk. wide, course S.15°W.; asc. 30 ft. along S. slope.
51.00	A spur, slopes SW.; desc. 50 ft. over SW. slope.
56.50	The head of a ravine, course SW.; desc 435 ft. over steep SW. slope, with frequent sandstone ledges.
73.50	A branch, 1 lk. wide, course N.65°W.; asc. 45 ft. along slope.
75.50	Top of ascent on N. slope; desc. 68 ft over NW. slope.
78.02	The cor. of secs. 23, 24, 25, and 26, Land mountainous and rolling. Soil, rocky clay and sandy clay loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, chinquapin, madrona, yew, dogwood, and cascara. Undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, salmonberry, slickleaf, thimbleberry, devil's- club, and salal.
	From the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34, and 35, on the bdy. of the Tp. N. 3° 35' E., bet secs 34 and 35. Descend 400 ft. over broken N. slope, changing to NW. slope.
13.40	A ravine, course W.; asc. 100 ft. over broken SW. slope.
22.90	A spur, slopes N.60°W.; desc. 250 ft. over broken N. slope, changing to NW. slope.
28.00	A ravine, from S. 5°W., course N.; desc. 70 ft. along ravine.
32.50	Leave ravine, course N.5°W.; desc. 82 ft. over NW. slope.
34.30	Marsh Creek, 6 lks. wide, course N.85°W.; asc. 275 ft. over broken S. slope.
41.56	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 34 and 35, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
