

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the
Subdivisional Lines of T. 20 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS
17.85

A spur, slopes S.70°W.; desc. 130 ft. over NW. slope.

21.60

A branch, 1 lk. wide, course W.; asc. 2 ft. along broken W. slope.

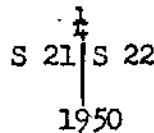
23.75

A branch, 2 lks. wide, course S.10°W.; asc. 450 ft. over SE. slope.

39.87

Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 21 and 22, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 in. in the ground, with brass cap marked



from which

A cedar, 22 ins. diam., bears S. 29° 45' E., 17 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S22 BT.

A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S.61 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W., 107 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S21 BT.

Ascend 40 ft. over SE. slope.

44.00

Top of ascent on flat-topped ridge, the divide bet. Smith River and South Sister Creek, bears S.80°E. and S.85°W.; a spur ridge, bears N.40°E. from this point; desc. 560 ft. over N. slope, changing to NE. slope.

60.90

The head of a ravine, course NW.; asc. 35 ft. along W. slope.

66.00

A spur, from S.30°E., slopes N.; desc. 155 ft. along spur.

72.50

Leave spur, slopes N.30°W.; desc. 100 ft. over NE. slope.

76.05

South Sister Creek, 50 lks. wide, course NW.; asc. 10 ft. over bottom land.

79.74

The cor. of secs. 15, 16, 21, and 22, monumented with a decomposing wooden stake, with no marks remaining, from which original bearing trees,

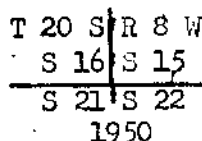
A fir, 60 ins. diam., bears N.44 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 33 lks. dist., scribed in the bark BT S 15 and other partial scribe marks. (record bearing, N.56°E.)

A cedar, 36 ins. diam., bears S.33°45'E., 26 lks. dist., plainly blazed, but scribe marks decayed. I reblaze alongside the old blaze and mark T20S R8W S22 BT. (Record bearing, S.43°E., 21 lks. dist.)

A fir, 70 ins. diam., bears S.54°W., 19 lks. dist., with scribe marks faintly visible in the bark. (Record bearing, S.60°W., 13 lks. dist.)

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked



from which new bearing trees

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.5°E., 77 lks. dist., marked T20S R8W S15 BT.
