

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Subdivisional
lines of T. 20 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

From the cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32, and 33, on the S. bdy. of the Tp.,
monumented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., 7 ins. above ground,
firmly set, marked and witnessed as described in the official record.

N. 0° 49' E., bet. secs. 32 and 33.

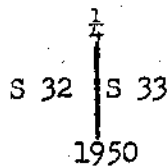
Descend 20 ft. over NE. slope, through heavy timber and dense under-
growth.

- 0.75 A ravine, course E.; asc. 139 ft. over SE. slope.
- 3.65 A spur, slopes E.; desc. 25 ft. over NE. slope.
- 4.75 A ravine, course E.; asc. 19 ft. over SE. slope.
- 9.40 A spur, slopes E.; desc. 200 ft. over NE. slope.
- 11.65 The dry bed of a stream, 3 lks. wide, course E.; asc. 308 ft. over
S. slope, changing to SE. slope.
- 19.60 A spur ridge, and a blazed trail, bears N. 60° E. and S. 60° W.; desc.
456 ft. over broken NW. slope, changing to N. slope.
- 38.15 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 32 and 33, determined at the record bearing
and distance from the original SW. bearing tree,

A cedar, 54 ins. diam., bears S. 30° W., 10 lks. dist., plainly
blazed and healed.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground,
with brass cap marked



from which new bearing tree

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N. 25° E., 61 lks. dist.,
marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S33 BT.

N. 0° 25' E., beginning new measurement.

Descend 10 ft. over N. slope.

- 0.40 A ravine, course N. 60° W.; asc. 24 ft. over SW. slope.
- 3.05 Top of ascent on W. slope; desc. 200 ft. over broken NW. slope.
- 11.10 A branch, 4 lks. wide, course NE.; asc. 183 ft. over SE. slope.
- 19.45 A spur, slopes S. 80° E.; desc. 53 ft. over N. slope.
- 22.50 A small ravine, course N. 60° E.; desc. 169 ft. over broken NE. slope.
- 26.45 A branch, 4 lks. wide, course S. 70° E.; asc. 325 ft. over S. slope,
changing to SE. slope.
- 40.53 The cor. of secs. 28, 29, 32, and 33, determined at the record bearing
and distance from the original NE., SE., and SW. bearing trees, as
follows:

A fir, 32 ins. diam., bears N. 38° E., 9 lks. dist.,
plainly blazed and healed.

An uprooted fir, 12 ins. diam., the stumphole of which bears
