

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Subdivisional
Lines of T. 20 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

- 37.30 Top of ascent on bottom land; desc. 5 ft. along bottom.
- 39.60 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 21 and 28, determined at the record bearing and distance from each of the original bearing trees, as follows:
- An uprooted hemlock, 20 ins. diam., the stump hole of which bears S.65°W., 34 lks. dist., with blaze decayed.
- An uprooted fir, 48 ins. diam., the stump hole of which bears N.45°W., 21 lks. dist., with blaze healed.
- At the corner point
- Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

- from which new bearing trees
- A fir, 60 ins. diam., bears N.30°E., 61 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S21 BT.
- A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S.26°W., 68 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S28 BT.

- S. 89° 57' W., beginning new measurement.
- Descend 20 ft. along broken S. slope, along N. edge of bottom.
- 5.15 A graded and blazed trail, bears N. and S.30°E.; desc. 20 ft. over bottom.
- 9.20 Right bank of Smith River, 120 lks. wide, course N.48 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W.
- 10.80 Left bank of Smith River; asc. 420 ft. over precipitous NE. slope, changing to E. slope.
- 19.60 A spur, slopes N.20°E.; desc. 115 ft. over NW slope.
- 22.60 A branch, 4 lks. wide, course N.30°E.; asc. 280 ft. over SE. slope.
- 28.55 A spur, slopes N.50°E.; desc. 65 ft. over NW. slope.
- 33.05 A ravine, course N. 65°E.; asc. 195 ft. over SE. slope.
- 37.75 A spur ridge, bears N.50°E. and South; desc. 25 ft. over NW. slope.
- 39.14 The cor. of secs. 20, ~~21~~, ~~28~~, and 29.
- Land mountainous, except in river bottom.
Soil, sandy clay loam.
Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, maple, chinquapin, dogwood, and madrona.
Undergrowth, vine maple, evergreen huckleberry, devil's-club, salal, salmonberry, thimbleberry, hazel, rhododendron, and bracken.

- From the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31, and 32, on the S. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., 7 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described in the official record.
- N. 1° 01' E., bet. secs. 31 and 32.
- Descend 280 ft. over NW. slope, changing to N. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
- 6.10 N. Fork of big Creek, 10 lks. wide, course E.; asc. 210 ft. over SE. slope.
