

Dependent Resurvey of Part of the South Boundary of
T. 21 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

- 32.60 A spur, slopes NE.; desc. 167 ft. over SE. slope.
- 35.80 Head of ravine, course NE.; desc. 115 ft. over broken NE. slope.
- 38.46 The corner of secs. 33 and 34, the locus of which is determined by reference to the record bearing and distance from each of the old bearing trees.

At point for corner,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 33 and 34, with brass cap mkd.

A hemlock, 22 ins. diam., bears N. 55° E., 78 lks. dist., with blaze healed. (Old B.T.)

A hemlock, 22 ins. diam., bears N. 72° W., 22 lks. dist., on which I uncover the scribe marks S 33 T 21 S R 8 W beneath the correct overgrowth for the date of the Byars survey. (Old B.T.)

A hemlock, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 82° E., 76 lks. dist., mkd. T 21 S R 8 W S 34 B T. (New B.T.)

A hemlock, 26 ins. diam., bears N. 46° 45' W., 87 lks. dist., mkd. T 21 S R 8 W S 33 B T. (New B.T.)

Land, mountainous.

Soil, loose sandy loam, 1st and 2nd rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, maple, yew, madrona, chinquapin, dogwood and cascara.

Undergrowth, bracken, rhododendron, vinemaple, salal, willow, salmonberry, hazel, slickleaf, manzanita, thimbleberry and poison oak.

Dependent Resurvey of the W. Bdy. of T. 21 S., R. 8 W.

"Reestablishment of the survey executed by William P. Wright, Deputy Surveyor, in 1883, of which there is a record of a partial retracement by Alonzo Gesner, Deputy Surveyor, in 1894."

After a careful investigation, it is developed that Gesner's recorded retracement of this line is entirely fictitious, that it is a deliberate fabrication on his part for the purpose of justifying his own work and creating a limiting boundary for T. 21 S., R. 9 W., and is therefore rejected as a suitable basis for restoration of lost corners referring to T. 21 S., R. 8 W.

From the cor. of ^{TPC} ~~secs.~~ 21 and 22 S., Rs. 8 and 9 W., heretofore described

N. 0° 48' E., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Desc. 412 ft. over broken NW. slope, through heavy dead timber and dense undergrowth.

4.25 A branch, 2 lks. wide, course NW.

24.20 A damp ravine, course W.; enter logged over area, bears E. and W.; asc. 38 ft. over broken SW. slope.
