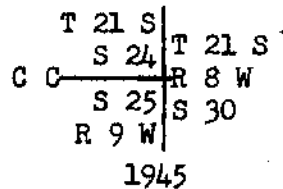


County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey of the W. Bdy. of T. 21 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS



from which

A dead fir, 26 ins. diam., bears N. 80° E., 96 lks. dist., on which I uncover the scribe marks C C T 21 S R 9 W S 24 & S 25 B T. (Old B.T.)

A fir stub, badly burned, 40 ins. diam., bears N. 31½° W., 56 lks. dist., on which no marks remain. (Old B.T.)

A fir, 48 ins. diam., bears N. 33° W., 218 lks. dist., mkd. T 21 S R 9 W S 24 C C B T. (New B.T.)

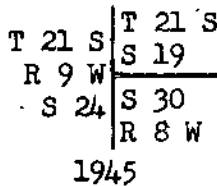
No other accessory available.

Desc. 12 ft. over broken W. slope.

42.81 The cor. of secs. 19 and 30, the locus of which is determined by reference to the record bearing and distance from the old NE. and SE. bearing trees.

At point for corner,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 19 and 30, with brass cap mkd.

The stump hole and badly decayed remains of a cherry, bears N. 52° E., 30 lks. dist., with no marks remaining on this old bearing tree.

The stump hole and badly decayed remains of a cherry, bears S. 26° E., 8 lks. dist., with no marks remaining on this old bearing tree.

A fir, 54 ins. diam., bears N. 17½° E., 360 lks. dist., mkd. T 21 S R 8 W S 19 B T. (New B.T.)

A dead fir, 52 ins. diam., bears S. 20° E., 135 lks. dist., mkd. T 21 S R 8 W S 30 B T. (New B.T.)

Land, mountainous,

Soil, loose sandy loam, 1st and 2nd rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, maple and cherry.

Undergrowth, rhododendron, willow, salmonberry, salal, arrowwood, slickleaf, hazel, manzanita, bracken, thimbleberry, raspberry, blackberry and poison oak.

N. 0° 27' E., on W. bdy. of sec. 19.

Asc. 9 ft. over SW. slope, through heavy dead timber and dense undergrowth in partially logged area, in burn.

1.40 A spur ridge, bears N. 10° W. and S. 10° E.; desc. 128 ft. over NE. slope.

5.50 A ravine, course E.; asc. 50 ft. over SE. slope.
