

Dependent Resurvey of the W. Bdy. of T. 21 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

Undergrowth, vinemaple, rhododendron, salmonberry, salal, slickleaf, manzanita, huckleberry, bracken, willow, hazel, thimbleberry, raspberry, and poison oak.

Dependent Resurvey of Part of the North Boundary of
T. 21 S., R. 8 W.

"Reestablishment of the survey executed by William P. Wright, Deputy Surveyor, in 1883."

From the cor. of Tps. 20 and 21 S., R. 8 W., heretofore described S. 88° 50' E., bet. secs. 6 and 31.

Over broken S. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth, in burn.

- 1.00 A spur, slopes S. 20° E.; desc. 103 ft. over broken E. slope.
- 3.00 Head of ravine, course SE.; asc. 46 ft. over SW. slope.
- 5.60 A spur, slopes S. 60° E.; desc. 487 ft. over NE. slope, changing to E. slope.
- 21.60 Dry bed of creek, 6 lks. wide, course S.; asc. 121 ft. over SW. slope where I find several original line blazes.
- 28.80 A spur, slopes S.; desc. 85 ft. over SE. slope.
- 31.30 A ravine, course S.; asc. 9 ft. over SW. slope.
- 32.50 A spur, slopes S.; desc. 207 ft. over SE. slope.
- 41.10 A branch of N. Fork of Big Creek, 10 lks. wide, course N. 75° E.; asc. 116 ft. over NW. slope.
- 49.60 Top of ascent on N. slope; desc. 130 ft. over NE. slope.
- 54.90 A branch, 3 lks. wide, course N.; asc. 126 ft. over W. slope.
- 57.32 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., a cedar tree, 20 ins. diam., burned off flush with the top of the ground.

At point for corner,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.

from which

A cedar, 28 ins. diam., bears N. 41° W., 4 lks. dist., mkd. B T $\frac{1}{4}$ S. (Old B.T.)

A cedar, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 31° W., 41 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S 31 B T. (New B.T.)

A fir, 32 ins. diam., bears S. 69° W., 42 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S 6 B T. (New B.T.)

Thence

S. 89° 22' E., with new measurement.
