A dead fir, 40 ins. diam., bears N. 58½° E., 42 lks. dist.,  
mkd. T 21 S R 8 W S 21 B T.

A hemlock, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 4° E., 162 lks. dist.,  
mkd. T 21 S R 8 W S 28 B T.

A fir, 32 ins. diam., bears S. 29° W., 263 lks. dist.,  
mkd. T 21 S R 8 W S 29 B T.

A dead fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 14° W., 42 lks. dist.,  
mkd. T 21 S R 8 W S 20 B T.

Raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.

The section corner is located on a rocky saddle of ridge, divide  
between Smith River and Umpqua River, bears E. and W.

From this point a triangulation station of the United States  
Geological Survey, designated "Vincent", published geographic  
position, latitude 43° 43' 26.134" N., and longitude 123° 39' 55.031"  
W., bears N. 55° 31' W., 26.14 chs. dist.; a brass tablet seated in  
a sandstone boulder, conforming to the record.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, loose sandy and rocky loam, 1st, 2nd and 3rd rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, maple, madrona, yew, chinquapin,  
cherry, dogwood and cascara.

Undergrowth, vinemaple, rhododendron, salmonberry, salal, slickleaf,  
manzanita, huckleberry, willow, hazel, bracken, raspberry, arrow-  
wood and poison oak.

From the cor. of secs. 21, 22, 27 and 28

N. 87° 59' W., bet. secs. 21 and 28.

Desc. 560 ft. over broken W. slope, through heavy dead timber and  
scattering green timber and dense undergrowth, in burn.

10.50 East Fork of Mosetown Creek, water in pools, 10 lks. wide, course  
N. 10° E.; asc. 320 ft. over NE. slope.

18.00 A spur, slopes NE.; asc. 170 ft. over broken NE. slope.

29.30 A ravine, course N.; asc. 100 ft. over E. slope.

32.00 A spur, slopes N. 20° E.; desc. 70 ft. over NW. slope.

35.50 A ravine, course N. 10° E.; asc. 53 ft. over NE. slope.

39.145 Proportional measurement.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground,  
for ¼ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.
