Dependent Resurvey of Part of the Subdivision of

CHAINS

- 40.30 Head of ravine, course NW.; asc. 49 ft. over NE. slope.
- 44.10 A spur, slopes N. 60° W.; desc. 574 ft. over SW. slope.
- 60.55 Dry bed of creek, 3 lks. wide, course NW.; asc. 166 ft. over NE. slope.
- 65.75 A spur, slopes NW.; desc. 188 ft. over SW. slope.
- 70.70 A ravine, course N. 30° W.; asc. 91 ft. over NE. slope.
- 72.50 A spur, slopes N. 20° W.; desc. 150 ft. over NW. slope.
- 75.65 Enter marshy lake, water 2 to 4 ft. deep, with soft mud bottom, bears NE. and SW.

Land, mountainous.
Soil, loose sandy loam, 1st and 2nd rate.
Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, maple, chinquapin, madrona, yew, cherry, dogwood and cascara.
Undergrowth, vinemaple, salmonberry, salal, rhododendron, thimbleberry, slickleaf, manzanita, bracken, willow, hazel, arrowwood, raspberry, blackberry, huckleberry and poison oak.

N. 0° 51' E., bet. secs. 16 and 17.

Asc. 470 ft. over SE. slope, through heavy dead timber and scattering green timber and dense undergrowth, in burn.

- 15.70 A spur, slopes E.; desc. 96 ft. over NE. slope.
- 17.70 A ravine, course N. 80° E.; asc. 23 ft. over SE. slope.
- 19.60 A spur, slopes E.; desc. 13 ft. over NE. slope.
- 22.50 A ravine, course SE.; asc. 88 ft. over SE. slope.
- 24.70 A spur, slopes E.; desc. 440 ft. over NE. slope, changing to N. slope.
- 33.65 A branch, 3 lks. wide, course S. 80° E.; asc. 126 ft. over SW. slope.
- 37.82 Proportional measurement.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.
