

Dependent Resurvey of Part of the Subdivision of
T. 21 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

A fir, 72 ins. diam., bears S. 52° W., 62 lks. dist.,
mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S 8 B T.

Asc. 22 ft. over SE. slope.

38.90 A ravine, course SE.; asc. 313 ft. over broken S. slope.

46.30 A spur, slopes N. 85° E.; desc. 135 ft. over broken N. slope.

49.00 A ravine, course NE.; asc. 27 ft. over SE. slope.

53.30 A spur, slopes E.; desc. 207 ft. over NE. slope.

57.00 A branch, 2 lks. wide, course SE.; asc. 451 ft. over SW. slope.,
changing to SE. slope.

66.60 A spur ridge, bears N. 80° E. and S. 80° W.; desc. 342 ft. over NE.
slope, changing to NW. slope.

73.90 A ravine, course NE.; desc. 25 ft. over broken NE. slope.

75.63 The cor. of secs. 4, 5, 8 and 9, the locus of which is determined
at the record distance from the old NE. bearing tree, and record
bearing and distance from the old SW. and NW. bearing trees.

At point for corner,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground,
for cor. of secs. 4, 5, 8 and 9, with brass cap mkd.

A burnt dead maple, 36 ins. diam., bears N. 2° W.; not N. 2° E.;
47 lks. dist., on which no marks remain. (Old B.T.)

A burnt dead fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S. 28° W., 12 lks. dist.,
with partial scribe marks on face of old blaze. (Old B.T.)

A burnt dead fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 57° W., 15 lks. dist.,
on which I uncover the scribe marks B T T 21 S R 8 W S 5.
(Old B.T.)

A fir, 32 ins. diam., bears S. 46 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W., 96 lks. dist.,
mkd. T 21 S R 8 W S 8 B T. (New B.T.)

Raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, loose sandy loam, 1st and 2nd rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, maple, chinquapin, madrona,
yew, cherry, dogwood and cascara.

Undergrowth, vinemaple, rhododendron, salmonberry, salal, huckle-
berry, thimbleberry, raspberry, arrowwood, willow, hazel, bracken,
blackberry and poison oak.

From the cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9 and 10

S. 89° 49' W., bet. secs. 4 and 9.

Descend 70 ft. over NW. slope, through heavy timber and dense under-
growth.

3.40 A ravine, course N.; asc. 218 ft. over NE. slope.
