CHAINS

- 10.20 A spur, slopes E.; desc. 19 ft. over SE. slope.
- 10.50 A ravine, course NE.; asc. 286 ft. over broken NE. slope.
- 17.40 A spur, slopes E.; desc. 135 ft. over SE. slope.
- 22.00 A ravine, course E.; asc. 77 ft. over NE. slope.
- 26.90 A spur, slopes SE.; desc. 456 ft. over broken SE. slope.
- 44.29 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., the locus of which is determined by reference to the record bearing and distance from each of the old bearing trees.
- At point for corner,
- Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.

- A burnt fir stub, 40 ins. diam., bears S. 24° W., 29 lks. dist., with no marks remaining on this old bearing tree.
- A maple, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 42° W., 66 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S 5 B T. (New B.T.)

- 15.67 Big Creek Road, bears N. 64° 45' E. and S. 71° W.
- 17.10 Big Creek, 25 lks. wide, course NE.; asc. 139 ft. over NW. slope.
- 29.40 A bare bedrock ravine with trickle of water, course NW.; asc. 299 ft. over NE. slope.
- 39.72 The cor. of secs. 4, 5, 8 and 9.
- Land, mountainous.
Soil, loose sandy and rocky loam, 1st, 2nd and 3rd rate.
Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, maple, madrona, chinquapin, yew, dogwood, cherry and cascara.
Undergrowth, vinemaple, salmonberry, salal, huckleberry, arrowwood, hazel, willow, bracken, thimbleberry, manzanita, slickleaf, rhododendron and poison oak.

- N. 1° 20' E., bet. secs. 31 and 32.
- Desc. 409 ft. over NE. slope, through heavy dead timber and scattering green timber and dense undergrowth, in burn.
