

DEPENDENT RESURVEY, PORTION OF N. BDY., T. 24 S., R. 3 W.

CHAINS

Land, mountainous.
Soil, sandy and rocky clay.
Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, yew, maple, alder, madrona and chinquapin; undergrowth, vinemaple, salal, salmonberry, devil's club, rhododendron and huckleberry.

N. 89°28' E., bet. secs. 5 and 32.

Descend 129 ft. over SE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth along N. edge of logged area.

- 6.20 A ravine, course S. 20° W.; asc. 75 ft. over SW. slope.
 - 13.55 A graded dirt road, bears N. 67° W. and S. 67° E.
 - 15.55 A spur, slopes SE.; desc. 297 ft. over broken E. slope.
 - 40.33 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 32, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
- Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 42 ins. diam., bears N. 29°45' E., 27 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S 32 BT.

A fir, 34 ins. diam., bears S. 1° W., 131 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S 5 BT.

Continue to descend 60 ft. over broken E. slope.

- 44.30 A branch, 2 lks. wide, course N. 20° E.; asc. 99 ft. over NW. slope.
- 50.70 A spur, slopes N.; desc. 255 ft. over NE. slope, through heavy timber.
- 66.50 Foot of descent on N. slope; asc. 16 ft. over NW. slope.
- 59.90 A spur, slopes N. 70° E.; descend 174 ft. over SE. slope. (Note by transcriber: This probably should be 69.90)
- 80.66 The cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32 and 33 as determined from the surviving original bearing trees:

A vinemaple, 5 ins. diam., bears S. 60° E., 36 lks. dist., with surface scar indicating old blaze.

A fir, 54 ins. diam., bears S. 5° W., 8 lks. dist., with partial scribe marks on old bark blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A hemlock, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 53 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° E., 30 lks. dist., mkd. T 23 S R 3 W S 33 BT.
